And if he cannot afford, let him fast, for it is a shield against evil.' (Reported by Ibn-iMesut).
- Those who guard their sexual organs except with their spouses or those whom their right hands possess, for (with regard to them) they are without blame. But those who crave something beyond that are transgressors. (Al-Mu'mun: 5-7). Commenting on these verses, some scholars of Shafi and Maliki hold the view that masturbation is forbidden.

Verses from Bible

- Matt 5:28-29 (NIV) (Jesus): But I tell you that anyone who looks at a woman lustfully has already committed adultery with her in his heart. If your right eye causes you to sin, gouge it out and throw it away. It is better for you to lose one part of your body than for your whole body to be thrown into hell.
- Eph 5:3 (NIV) But among you there must not be even a hint of sexual immorality, or of any kind of

- impurity, or of greed, because these are improper for God's holy people.
- Th 4:2-8 (NIV) For you know what instructions we gave you by the authority of the Lord Jesus. It is God's will that you should be sanctified: that you should avoid sexual immorality; that each of you should learn to control his own body in a way that is holy and honorable, not in passionate lust like the heathen, who do not know God. For God did not call us to be impure, but to live a holy life. Therefore, he who rejects this instruction does not reject man but God, who gives you his Holy Spirit.

CONCLUSION

From above mentioned verses, it becomes clear that frequent use of masturbation is prohibited in both religions. However, in our society, we have to learn to control our desires in a way that is holy and honorable.
